Clark, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the public lands," for the North West quarter of the South East

quarter of Section six, and the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section seven, the North West quarter of the South East quarter, and the South West quarter of the North East quarter of Section five, in Township forty three North, of Range seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at St. Louis, Missouri, containing one hundred and sixty acres,

according to the OFFICIAL PLAT of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said John L. Clark,

Now know ye, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said John L. Clark, and to his heirs, the said Tract above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging; unto the said John L. Clark, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Franklin Pierce, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
