#### He Suffers Fatal Heart Attack While Driving.

Baxter B. Blythe, 71, of 1823 East Eighty-first street terrace, died early today after suffering a heart attack while driving his car at Seventy-fifth street and Troost avenue. His wife, Mrs. Edna Blythe, who was with him in the car, said he apparently died before an ambulance arrived at the scene.

Mr. Blythe was born in West Plains, Mo., and lived in Kansas City most of his life. Until his retirement four years ago, Mr. Blythe was a sales supervisor at the Stanley Home Products company.
