Ozark Sheriff Finds Still

Sheriff George A. Rose, of Ozark county, who is known as one of the most efficient officers in this part of the state, captured a big moonshine still in operation near Sowder, in Ozark county just before the holidays. The still was in operation in a log building that was well chinked and plastered. When the sheriff and Constable Sullivan, of Gainesville, knocked on the door and it was opened, the officers stepped inside and took charge of the largest and most complete moonshine still found in the Ozark country in 1921. It was running at its full capacity and the finished product was pouring in a generous stream from the worm. The still consisted of a 55 gallon gasoline tank, two milk cans, a cooling box and worm. This was loaded on a truck and taken to Gainesville. Six men were in the building when the raid took place and all were arrested and taken to Gainesville. They were George Snelson, Elmer Parker, Joe Silvey, Frank Riley, Phil Dye and Lon Thornburg.
