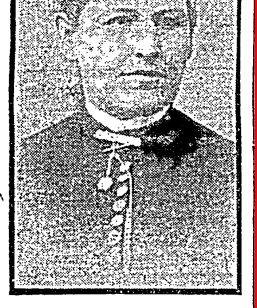
WILLIAM HARTLEY GROSSES PLAINS IN EARLY DAYS

HEIR TO THRONE POPULAR Austrian Archduke Endears Himself to Hungarians.

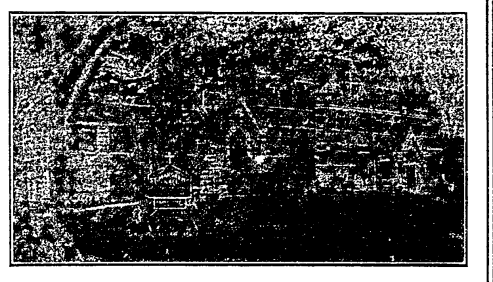
