one horse, choice of my stock, and cow, choice of my stock  
one hen and piggs, six Pork hogs, one feather bed and  
furniture & bed, one pot and skillet, all my dishes  
plates, knives, forks, Stalls & chairs, my dwelling house  
with garden and appurtenances and two acres of land where  
the map think proper to choose, all of which to have  
and to hold from and after my death during her life  
and widowhood then to be equally divided between  
my two young children Wilson and Elizabeth Rackley  
I give and bequeath to my eldest son Garrison Rackley  
one dollar, I give and bequeath to my daughter and  
son in law William R. Maria Sarah Maria one dollar  
I give and bequeath to my son Wilson Rackley one  
horse, one cow and calf which he becomes of a  
I give and bequeath to my youngest daughter Elizabeth  
Rackley one bed and furniture & bed, one cow & half  
pound piggs at lawful age or marriage, which the said  
parents of property I will and order to be given to the  
said respective Legates, and as to all the rest of my  
personal and real estate, residue or remainder, my  
near girl Betty and all my land except that granted  
to my wife I will and order to be sold in a twelve  
month credit and the money equally divided between  
my children here named, Micajah Rackley, Phoebe  
Rackley maid woman, Silas J. Rackley & Elizabeth  
Rackley, but a sum of sixty dollars of my daughter  
Phoebe's share part and other by appointing the man  
Nolan and Robert Cramp, guardian of the my last  
will and testament hereby revoking all former
