**118. REBECCA<sup>4</sup> HULL** was born Illinois October 1838. She married about 1856 Fletcher W. Carter, born Illinois about 1833. He was in Clinton Co. Ill. 1850 Federal Census, in the family of Oliver Maddux. He, farmer, was in Clinton Co. 1860 Federal Census, family of 3, 1870, 8. Fletcher bought 274 acres Clinton Co. from Oliver Maddux's heirs, 16 May 1863.<sup>124</sup> Rebecca's uncle, Benjamin Hull, was appointed her guardian 1848, still acting 1855 when she received her mother's share of Absalom<sup>7</sup> Sharp's estate. She received a pension from 1848-53 for her father's military service. She was in Clinton Co. 1850 Federal Census, in the family of Oliver Maddux; her aunt, Sarah Hull, was Oliver's wife. In 1853 Rebecca was living Bond Co. Ill., possibly in Beaver Prairie with her uncle, Benjamin Hull.

**119. HARDIN<sup>4</sup> FRANKLIN (FRANK) SHARP** was born Assumption Parish La. 9 May 1850, died Donaldsonville La. 21 March 1881, buried Thibodaux La. He married first Louisiana 6 August 1873 Lucy Edith Lawless of Lafourche Parish, who died October 1874 soon after the death of her infant son. Frank married second Carlyle Ill. 30 Sept. 1880 Louisa A. (or Mary Louise) Woollums, born Illinois 19 May 1865, daughter of Alexander H. and Eratha Selina (\_\_\_\_) Woollums. Her father died April 1865; her mother married 1866 John Meredith Journey, son of John M. and Frances<sup>2</sup> (Sharp) Journey. Lou's guardian 18 May 1868 was her step-father, John M. Journey; she used the name of "Journey" for a while, lived with the Journeys in Carlyle, 1880 Federal Census. She was said to have been a beautiful woman; belonged to the Baptist Church, Carlyle, baptized 4 May 1884, dismissed by letter 1895.<sup>125</sup> She married second Powell Griscom, who died about 1917-18. She and her daughter lived Carlyle 1894, New Orleans La. 1922; they were visited there in the 1930's or 1940's by Bessie<sup>6</sup> (Sharp) Marsh.

Frank was a river pilot. He owned the steamship "Minnie" which carried his body from Donaldsonville to Thibodaux for burial.

**120. ELEANORA<sup>4</sup> MARY SHARP** (twin) was born Assumption Parish La. 9 Dec. 1859, died Donaldsonville La. 23 August 1885. She married St. John's Episcopal Church, Baton Rouge La. 10 Feb. 1881 Clement Plato Binnings, born Thibodaux La. 29 Oct. 1856, died St. John (?La.) 17 Dec. 1901 (?), son of S. A. Binnings. He married second Eleanora's first cousin, Lillie<sup>4</sup> Beauregard Sharp, daughter of Andrew<sup>3</sup> Jackson Sharp.

**121. ELIZA<sup>4</sup> JANE GARDNER** was born Virginia (now West Virginia) probably about 1823, died probably Ohio after 1895. She married probably before 1850 James Casner Campbell, born Washington Co. Pa. 18 Nov. 1823, died Mulberry Mo. 19 August 1884.<sup>127</sup> James was a United Presbyterian (then called Associate Reformed) minister. He graduated from Jefferson College 1845, Allegheny Theological Seminary 1848, ordained 1848 by the Presbytery of Steubenville Ohio. He was the first pastor of the Associate Reformed Church, Wellsville Ohio 1848-55; at the United Presbyterian Church Paris Pa. 1855-75. He was director of Allegheny Theological Seminary 1853-9. He was head of an Academy at Paris Pa.; his wife's cousin, Lysander Steen, was one of his pupils. He moved to Hopewell,
