 do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release <sup>abund</sup> and confirm unto  
 the said Thomas S. McMahon, his heirs and assigns forever a  
 certain tract or parcel of land hereinafter described, to-wit: the  
 east half of the west half of the northeast quarter of section nineteen  
 township three north of range seven west of the third principal  
 meridian, to contain forty acres be the same more or less, situate  
 in the county of Madison and state of Illinois. To have and to hold  
 the said land together with the hereditaments and appurtenances  
 thereunto belonging and all the estate, right, title, interest, claim  
 and demand whatsoever both in law and equity of the said  
 Archibaus Walker and Susan his wife or, in and to the above bargained  
 premises to the sole and only proper use, benefit and behoof
